

Estate Planning Attorney Answers Questions About Planned Giving

Tambre Clark, director of investor relations for United Way of Brevard County, recently sat down with Ganon to discuss how someone considering a legacy gift might get started. Read on to see Ganon's responses to her questions.

Q. If someone is interested in leaving a legacy as part of their will, what steps do they need to take?

A. They should contact their estate planning attorney or seek an attorney experienced in estate and charitable planning to discuss available options.

Q. Why is it important to make these decisions?

A. If you die without an estate plan, your assets which are subject to probate will be distributed according to the laws of your state and not according to your wishes. This would not include charitable organizations that you have been supporting during your lifetime.

Estate planning is for everyone and will help plan for disability, death; and accomplish your estate planning, tax, family and philanthropic goals.

Q. Are there simple ways to leave a legacy?

A. A simple way to create a legacy is by naming a charitable organization as a beneficiary under your will, trust, retirement account or life insurance.
